## In Mary's Footsteps: Living Out Discipleship in the TEC Family

Dear TEC Family,

*"Mary is our quiet and reassuring companion in our journey to the heart of Christ...the perfect example of what it means to be a disciple," (TEC © Manual, Section X, pg. 26).*

**L**ately I've been thinking of, listening to and talking a lot to Mary, our Mother. **As I suspect you know already, our Congress this summer will be focusing on the gift of Mary in our lives—as our Guide to Perfect Discipleship.** So I've been wondering—is there any such thing as "perfect discipleship?" Is that even possible?



That depends, of course, on how one defines "perfect." I think we often misunderstand the concept when applying it to ourselves as human beings. For example, a chair finds its perfection in how comfortably it "sits" a person and how it fits with the décor of the room. A "perfect" chair for someone who is 4'8" tall would not sit a person 6'4" very well.

**Perfection as applied to objects reflects a fixed reality—a "done deal." However, we all know that "God isn't finished with me (any of us) yet."** None of us are static, and so we can't be judged on any particular state of being at any one time.

Perfection for us who would be disciples of Jesus consists in our willingness to GROW everyday and change daily as we seek that total and on-going conversion of heart. **What better guide to such growth than our Mother?** Who understands more than mothers the nature of growth? Do you seek to be a perfect disciple of Jesus? Don't worry. If you are asking, seeking, and knocking on the door, you qualify as

perfect." Just don't ever stop! You are not—and must never be—a "static reality."

I'm looking forward to meeting many of you at the Congress this summer. In the meanwhile, may you live, grow, and delight in the perfection of God's love for you—and continue to seek out the ways He will show you each day to mature in His love! Blessings, peace, and prayers!
