New Executive Director Selected for the TEC Conference!

The TEC Leadership Council is pleased to announce the Holy Spirit-guided transition to a new Executive Director. Ron will be sorely missed as Executive Director but we hope and pray that he continues to remain active in TEC for many years to come.

Leading the TEC Conference for the foreseeable future will be William D. (Billy) O'Regan IV. Billy has not only a law degree but he has a master's degree in Theology. He currently serves as Region Coordinator for his region which includes New Orleans, where he lives with his wife, Sara. Billy is the immediate past chair of the TEC Leadership Council and also chairs the Spirituality Ministry Team. We trust in God's call and loving hand in this transition and we all pray for Billy and his new ministry as our Executive Director.

Transforming the Focus from Weekend to Fourth Day:

How Wichita is Going Fourth

Ten years ago Wichita TEC was a strong TEC community. We had more candidates applying than we had room for on a weekend and about twice as many people applying to serve on the team than we needed. There were regular gatherings of the TEC community outside of the weekend, but then, for various reasons, those gatherings stopped and we became weekend focused. Through the years we had dropped from having 36 candidates on a weekend to averaging 12-15 and we were scarcely receiving any team applications.

A new and revitalized TEC Core started holding quarterly gatherings for the TEC community. They consisted of a pot luck dinner, guest speaker and social/game time. Out of the discussions taking place at these gatherings we began to realize how the quality of our TEC weekend itself had also slipped over the last several years. Thanks in part to some of the Core team having attended a Communities of Faith & Follow-through workshop (CF&F) we knew that in order to strengthen our weekends we had to strengthen the Fourth Day and the TEC community's knowledge of TEC. What did we do?

Besides continuing the quarterly gathering we started *Raise Praise*, a two hour gathering before the Hoot for prayer, praise & worship and a meal. This started to increase attendance at our Hoots and invigorate our community. This invigoration led to more active recruiting and our candidate numbers started rising and once again we had more people applying to serve on the team than we could use. This excess of team applications led to the creation of another program, *Harvesters*. *Harvesters* started out as a way to involve those who applied, but were not selected to serve on the team. *Harvesters* would meet on the two Sundays prior to the weekend to pray for the weekend, write wheat letters and form community.

In January of 2012 we started a new program called *Grains of Wheat* that takes place twice a year. We gather on Friday from 7-10 pm for a dessert social. It is purely social/game time except for closing prayer. Those 21 and over are welcome to spend the night. Saturday is our education piece. We meet from 9 am – 3 pm. Members of our TEC community give talks over particular aspects of TEC and then we have small and large group discussions. Our first *Grains of Wheat* had the sub-topic *Preparing the Field* and was about what takes place prior to the weekend. It was a great learning/sharing experience. Fr. Lanzrath talked/challenged us about what wheat really is and what a wheat letter really should contain.

Following our first *Grains of Wheat* the TEC Core realized that we could and should be doing so much more with *Harvesters*. So additions were made to include pieces to educate about TEC and it is open to all members of the TEC community. The first Sunday that *Harvesters* gather we have a pot-luck, adoration, hear a meditation on Wheat, hear a talk about how to write wheat letters, we write wheat letters and sing praise and worship songs. At the second gathering we hear a meditation on living out the Paschal Mystery in the Fourth Day.

We have truly become focused on the Fourth Day of our TEC community and out of that our candidate numbers and team applications are back to where they were ten years ago and the quality of our weekends is MUCH improved. We have people who are driving 4 hours to be a part of *Harvesters* and our TEC community is anxious for the next *Grains of Wheat*.

In our case, and perhaps in that of many other communities, when numbers start falling you start focusing on the weekend itself. What we discovered was that when we started focusing on the Fourth Day of the TEC community, instead of the weekend, that's when the weekend started to recover.


