# TEC IS VERY MUCH ALIVE!

EC, like the life of grace of Christ on which it is built, is very much alive. It is a movement that, like a clear mountain stream flowing through the lives of many youth and young adult Catholics, and their adult mentors, touches and transforms their minds and hearts. Its effect is gauged by the degree to which it initiates discipleship. Its product is Christhood, a living friendship with Christ as our brother. It ever enriches and invigorates our vocation—to walk in companionship with Jesus. TEC is truly a living movement.

A very good opportunity to check the state of its health was offered by the recent TEC Congress. The persons who were privileged to attend the Congress were very much a cross section of TEC leadership and of persons giving their lives to promoting TEC.

Our evaluation is based on what we heard and observed there and on the written evaluations of those who attended as well. The very theme of the Congress placed emphasis on the right focal points. The response of those attending reflects well the overall message. One said: "I felt the weekend was very uplifting, insightful, and spirit lead! I feel rejuvenated to return to my TEC community and not only plant more seeds

but do a better job in tending the seeds already planted." Another said: "It reinforced that our lifelong faith journey is not something we do when we have extra time available," "TEC teaches us to be engaged in Paschal Mystery living every day of our lives." These same responses are echoed among many others who were there.

The focus of the TEC Movement is therefore right on target--our relationship with the Lord. I found the leaders whom I met consciously and intentionally engaged in living within a loving and committed relationship with Christ--and in their love relationship with Him--their love for one another. The living out of this love is being done in their practical down-to-earth daily lives. TEC is not designed as a one-stand uplifting thrill. It aims at establishing a Christ-centered relationship that will become a permanent pattern in our lives. The degree to which that becomes true is the hallmark of success in the movement. Brian and Brett Mathiowetz's witness is a good example of this truth. The role of the adult mentors is to foster, facilitate and strengthen Christhood in themselves and in the youth and young adults with whom they share

### **TEC** is **Very Much Alive!**

In their self-evaluation, the participants expressed two concerns for their local communities back home: (1) keeping the adult faith community current and vital and (2) the follow-up portion of the movement.

One participant said: "It is always good to have reinforcement letting us know that we are not alone in our walks and share similar struggles and triumphs." One of the greatest challenges is to keep the adult faith community current and vital. Routine and attrition are the problems. When some adults have presided over the TEC process many times they come to know the schedule well but lose their personal zest for the task. Instead of experiencing each encounter as a fresh and unique experience they view it as routine and thus fail to breathe enthusiastic life into it. When this happens it is time to schedule one of the workshops offered by the TEC Conference to recharge their spiritual batteries. The best way to recruit new adults is through the enthusiasm of the current leaders. As one participant said: "Follow-up for leaders! This ongoing education at the local level is so very important."

The second reason it is important to schedule a workshop by the TEC Conference is that new adults are constantly coming into the community. While the original group may have been adequately trained on the essentials of the TEC process, the newcomers are often integrated into their role with only casual insights shared. As a result what they perceive as a solid guideline is

in reality a watered down version. Although they have good will they see only the surface of the spiritual process. The local community would be wise to sponsor a TEC Conference workshop for them. TEC is too precious to be allowed to go unfocused.

"The concept of abundance is a challenge to be more aware of God's grace in my life and in our community. Our community can improve how we tend the seeds planted in the candidates' spiritual life." Follow-up was the concern of the greatest number of participants. We would suggest two things. First, have your local TEC leaders copy the section of the TEC Manual on Follow-up (Pages IX-23-48) and dialogue through the design for the follow-up presented there. (Many leaders talk about it but never actually read the material.) Then, brainstorm around these principals as to how your community can bring them to life among the youth "in whom you have planted seeds of Christhood." Second, establish an ongoing team of adults and youth to plan monthly gatherings. The setting should resemble that of the TEC weekend. The above section on Follow-up suggests a large variety of subjects that could be presented and discussed. Think about all the topics that entered into the chats that Jesus had with his disciples when they were alone together. Try to gather your vouth around Jesus and talk about what matters in their lives. PEACE!

### St. Therese Feast day - October 1

Society of the Little Flower.....

Therese Martin was born to Louis Martin and Zelie Guerin on January 2, 1873. At the age of 15, she entered the Carmelite convent at Lisieux, France. With the religious name of Sr. Therese of the Child Jesus and the Holy Face, she lived a hidden life of prayer. She was gifted with great intimacy with God. Through sickness and darkness, she remained faithful, rooted in God's powerful love. She died on September 30, 1897, at the age of 24.

The world came to know her through her autobiography, "The Story of A Soul." She described her life as "a little way of spiritual childhood." She lived each day with unshakable confidence in God's love. What matters in life is "not great deeds, but great love."

The inspiration of her life and her powerful presence from heaven touched so many people so quickly that she was solemnly canonized on May 17, 1925 by Pope Pius XI. Had she lived, she would have only been 52 years old at the time of her canonization. In 1997, St. Therese was declared a Doctor of the Church by Pope John Paul II.

"My mission - to make God loved - will begin after my death," she said. "I will spend my heaven doing good on earth. I will let fall a shower of roses." Countless lives have been touched by her intercession, and millions have imitated her "little way." She has been acclaimed the "greatest saint of modern times." Everywhere in the world, her roses continue to fall.
