	Continuous prayerful discernment: Do you still have the resources in your community? Spiritual adults, the right atmosphere? Need for TEC? Facilities, supplies, equipment?	Continuous improving of the land and property.
	Continue to seek support from the Bishop, and make yearly reports, so he is informed.	Maintain your building permit

	Ongoing Faith Formation of Adult leaders through the TEC Conference and local Diocesan Programs.	Keeping the Foundation strong
	Check with the TEC Conference to stay updated and to receive additional support materials as needed.	Quality Materials to support your TEC Community
	TEC Manual Serves as guide- acquire the license from the TEC Conference by attending a <i>Renewing the Vision of TEC</i> , and the <i>Communities of Faith and Follow Through</i> training workshops.	Blueprints – brings clarity to what the TEC House could look like.
	Core group rooted in prayer – Able to read blueprint (spiritual vision & practical insights) and carry vision to others. Call forth others to learn about and help build TEC. Provide formation and on-going evaluation of TEC Movement and its leaders.	Skilled labor – the builders
	Spiritual Director for TEC to support and guide the Core group and TEC Movement; promote TEC among priests and others.	Serves as General contractor or building inspector with members of Core team.
	Community prepared to give witness to communal faith and follow through with practical details.	Members prepared to live in the house that is built
	Hold a TEC weekend	New members move into the house that has been built.
	Follow-Up for candidates after the weekend; Ongoing discernment and formation within the TEC community who continue to celebrate, learn and pray together to keep TEC healthy.	Ongoing care of the home and those who live there.
